Although the Chiefs suffered from a devastating losing streak last season, they're ranked fourth in the league this season with a record of 11 wins and 4 losses. With Andy Reid as their new headcoach the Chiefs are formidable opponents and should be taken seriously. Alex Smith may be new to the team as well, but he has adjusted to his receivers and the receivers to him. Throwing for a total of 3,340 yds and 24 touchdowns. The Chiefs' offensive line is a formidable force despite all the injuries. They have allowed the Chiefs to run a total of 2,056 yds and 17 touchdowns this season. Eric Fischer, No. 1 draft pick, had struggled early in his rookie career but is expected to bounce back next season better than before. The Chiefs' defense is as formidable, if not greater,

Alex Smith

After being dropped by the San Francisco 49ers, Alex Smith has done a tremendous job as starting QB for the Kansas City Chiefs. He threw for over 3,000 yds and 23 TDs in the regular season and helped lead them toward the playoffs. With a pass rating of 88, he has only thrown a minimum of 8 interceptions in the regular season.

Jamaal Charles

Jamaal Charles has been possibly the greatest reason the Chiefs made it to the playoffs with a record of 11 wins and 4 losses in the regular season. Rushing 1,287 yds in only 259 attempts, Jamaal Charles averaged a total of 5 yds per carry. Jamaal Charles is one of the top running backs in the league so far.



Denver Broncos

No team deserves to be at the superbowl more than the Broncos. With the great Peyton Manning behind the center and his 4 receivers: Erik Decker, Wes Welker, Demaryius Thomas, and Julius Thomas. Even so, you can take away all the top receivers and the Broncos will still win because their O-line is so strong that they can protect Manning until he finds an open man. And then there's his famous "Omaha!" call. When he sees something in the defense he likes or doesn't like, he'll shout "Omaha!" to change the play. Omaha has so many meanings that it's nearly impossible for the defense to figure out the audible. But forget about Peyton for now. Let's talk Special Teams. Matt Prater, who only missed one out of 26 attempts, has kicked a career high of 64 yds. Britton Colquitt has punted

for a total of 2,893 yds averaging 44.5 yds per punt. The returner, Trindon Holiday has averaged 27.7 yds on kick off and 8.5 yds on punts. He has only returned the ball for a TD only twice total. You can't be a super bowl team without a great defense and the Denver Broncos have a mean defense. Danny Trevathan, one of the big names on this defense, has had a huge impact on opposing offenses. He has sacked two opposing QB's for a total loss of 18 yds. He's also tackled a total of 128 players and forced 4 fumbles and he has intercepted the ball three times now. Cromartie, who also caught 3 interceptions returned one for a pick six. This team is one that can comeback from a lost game but should never need to. With an offense like theirs, it should be no problem for them to score and vise-versa for their defense.

He has a total of 14 TD's and has had caught the ball for a total of 92 receptions. His longest reception in the 2013 regular season was 78 yds long.

Peyton Manning. The words "outsanding," and "amazing," would be an under statement about him. Out of 659 attempts he has completed 450 throws down the field for a whopping 5,477 yds and 55 TD's. The avg. yds gained per play would be 8.3. But not all the credit can go to him. His offensive line is like an wall only allowing 18 sacks.
