Eighty-three year old head coach Joe Paterno's Penn State Nittany Lions could have a great year this coming season if they fix a few problems on their team. The biggest mystery heading into the fall will be who of PSU's three underclassmen will be the signal caller for their opener against Youngstown State.

The coaching staff have made it known that after disappointing performance by all three QBs will be pushed hard this summer until one of them wins the position. Running the

ball should come a lot easier for the Nittany Lions with 1,000-yard-rusher Evan Royster returning for his senior year. On defense, Penn State will have to replace their two leading tacklers Josh Hull and Navaro Bowman, both be plying their trade on Sundays in the NFL next season.

The Wisconsin Badgers had the making of a national championship contender in 2010, but came up short on the road against the surprise team of the year Michigan State and lost out on their chance to potentially play in the Bowl Championship Series National Championship game.

An 11-1 regular season record earned the Badgers a share of the Big Ten Conference (represented the Conference via a tiebreaker) and a Rose Bowl berth against BCS-buster Texas Christian University. Costly

turnovers and three botched field goals cost Wisconsin their first Rose Bowl victory since 1999.

The Badgers return 13 starters from last season's team, including their two sophomore running backs, James White and Monte Ball, who ran for over a combined 2,048 yards.

Veteran starting quarterback Scott Tolzein has graduated, but the Badgers won the recruiting war for former NC State quarterback Russell Wilson over the summer.
