

MIAMI HURRICANES



SEASON SUMMARY

The Miami Hurricanes had what must have been the most stellar season in college football history. The Miami Hurricanes were as perfect a college football team could be. The Hurricanes went 14-0 with 14 shutouts and ranks #1 in all polls and statistical categories. The Hurricanes won the ACC championship blowing past Florida State and just tore to pieces an undefeated Florida team. The Hurricanes also have 12 first team All-Americans, and 11 second teamers. Not to mention Sophomore Heisman Winner Jacory Harris, Maxwell Trophy Winner Javarris James, and Butkus winner Sean Spence. The 2009 Hurricanes are expected to go down in history as "The Best Team in the History of College Football," past the illustrious 2001 Hurricanes.

OFFENSE

The Hurricanes were extremely well balanced this season with exactly a 1:1 ratio for run and pass plays. The offense was

lead by Sophomore QB Jacory Harris who passed for 7,989 yards and 79 TDs. The Hurricanes also amassed 6,985 yards and 85 TDs on the ground from Javarris James (2,755 yds, 37 TDs), Graig Cooper (2,101 yds, 19 TDs), Jacory Harris (1,275 yds, 9 TDs), and Freshmen Bryce Brown (854 yds, 10 TDs). The Hurricanes also had 5 different receivers and tightends with 1,000+ yds in receiving. The offensive line gave up no sacks the entire season.

DEFENSE

The Hurricanes lead the nation with a number one ranking in all defensive categories. Zero points allowed, +48 turnover ratio, average of -21 yards rushed against, and an average of 3 yards passed on. The Hurricane D was lead by Sophomore Butkus Award winner Sean Spence. The Hurricanes caused and recovered 28 fumbles and snagged 20 interceptions. The Hurricanes defensive front applied relentless pres-

sure all throughout the season with 29 sacks and 80 tackles for a negative gain. Former Hurricanes Free Safety comments "It's just unbelievable the level of talent they have."

2010 OUTLOOK

The Hurricanes will be losing just about the entire roster to the NFL draft this off-season. Jacory Harris and runningback Bryce Brown are the only offensive starters expected to return and Sean Spence the only defensive starter returning. All the Hurricanes leaving for the draft are expected to dominate a majority of the 1st and 2nd round. On a brighter note, the Hurricanes are once again signing on the number 1 recruiting class of 2010 with 35 of the top 50 high school prospects and 67 of the top 150. The Hurricanes are also expected to sign JMU Transfer Mark Trimakus; a surprise stand-out walk-on linebacker and Division I-AA All American. The Hurricanes will be fielding another young yet impressive team next year.
